





Say no to bullying

What is Bullying?

Bullying can be...

Emotional

Hurting peoples feelings, leaving you out.

Physical

Punching, kicking, spitting, hitting or pushing.

Verbal

Being teased or name calling.

Written

Letters, notes, graffiti.

Cyber

Saying unkind things by text, email, online gaming, through apps and on the internet.

The governors, staff at school, parents and children will work together to:

- ◆ Make our school a place where everyone can feel safe and happy. This means everyone says no to bullying.
- ◆ We will help everyone to get on with each other and we believe that everyone has the right to be who they are.
- ◆ We will always take bullying seriously.

If you feel you are being bullied you should:

- ⇒ Tell someone!
- ⇒ Tell them to STOP.
- ⇒ Talk firmly.
- ⇒ Talk friendly.
- ⇒ Walk away.

You should not keep it to yourself!

If you see someone else being bullied:

- ◆ Don't walk away and ignore the bullying.
- ◆ Let the bully know what they are doing.
- ◆ Tell the bully to stop if it is safe.
- ◆ Don't stay silent, tell someone so the bullying will stop.
