HEAD TEACHER UPDATE

Every Year the School Governors, with the School Leadership team, review and evaluate the school's provision, curriculum and standards along with the outcomes of the parent questionnaires. Together we identify the key priorities for the academic year and these key priorities from part of the school improvement plan which will further raise standards. This year, we will be focusing on the following four areas:

1. To raise attainment and increase rates of progress in key subjects and / or key groups across KS2 by summer 2019 and maintain standards in phonics and KS1 in line with national expectations.
2. To improve the quality of Quality First Teaching to be consistently good or better with a focus on planning, organisation of learning, task design, feedback, marking and assessment within all learning with the impact of these being seen in pupils' raised attainment for all children.
3. To further embed the school learning values across the school by incorporating them in task design and continued development of the Integrated Curriculum ensuring a broad and balanced curriculum for all children.
- 4 Leadership is developed further with middle leaders being able to give a clear account for the positive impact of their work on raising attainment and further improving the quality of teaching and learning.

We have a fantastic school community but there are always ways we can improve. You will know from previous newsletters that our mantra this year is 'Journey to Excellence'. This applies to all aspects of school. We have high expectations of our children starting with punctuality, great attendance, wearing school uniform, being self disciplined and polite. The staff create a safe, welcoming and purposeful learning environments and our fantastic teachers plan and deliver a curriculum that engages, challenges and inspires children in their learning to enable them to reach the highest standards.
