GDPR—General Data Protection Regulations

You will have received a letter recently from the PTFA asking parents to sign up for an online booking and payment scheme, similar to the schools Wise Pay system. When the PTFA organise an event, they are responsible for the safety of all the children that attend the event, therefore the PTFA require contact details and health information. Previously the school has given attendance lists for the committee members to use at the event and these have then been returned to the school. On most occasions senior staff members attend events and can access children's information in an emergency, however with the introduction of GDPR it would be good practice that the PTFA have their own system for collecting this information prior to events. The PTFA are members of the National PTFA Body who are promoting 'classlist' primarily as an online registration and payment system for events. Of course if any parent does not wish to use this system they will need to fill in a booking form and pay directly for events. I have attached the Privacy Statement for you to read. In line with GDPR regulations, the school is unable to give out lists of children in classes for party invitations or Christmas cards.

PARKING

The area in front of the vehicle & pedestrian entry gates is now a 'No Parking' zone. This includes dropping off & collecting for any event, club or activity before or after school. Signs have been placed for your attention.

We have had a number of near miss accidents reported and have decided to implement a ban on vehicular parking in this area. The only vehicles to park in this area are the schools mini buses for unloading / loading of children in a safe zone.

The vehicle gates are to be kept clear at all times. Thank you for your co-operation.

GOVERNOR UPDATE

You will probably be aware that every school has a Board of Governors to support the school's strategic development and effective leadership. This year we are keen to make the work of the Governing Body more visible to parents and ensure that the thoughts of parents are most effectively integrated into our work. For the past three years, we have conducted a full parent survey each Spring to seek your views on the school.

Unfortunately, we don't receive many responses to these surveys and so this year Governors will attend parent consultation evenings to speak to parents. Naturally we're not likely to be able to catch every parent, but hope that it will provide us with a fuller set of views.

Additionally, after each of our full Governing Body Meetings, which take place half termly, one of our Governors will provide an update on the newsletter. This will serve to gradually introduce our Governors and outline the nature of our work. As the Chair of Governors, it is my turn to start.

I joined the Governing Body in 2014 and became Chair of Governors in September 2015. It has been an interesting time with significant curriculum changes and reducing financial budgets across the sector. We have converted to academy status and more recently joined Reach South Multi-Academy Trust. In June, we had our very encouraging OFSTED inspection. The school has navigated these turbulent times very successfully and is very well placed for the coming years.

A few weeks ago we had our first formal meeting of the school year. Each governor has specific link roles including a link to one year group. We first conducted an hour-long 'learning walk' where we visited our link year group to meet the teachers and discuss their plans and aspirations for the coming year.

During the formal meeting that followed, we discussed:

- any key thoughts that had emerged from this learning walk;
- the appointment of two new governors, one co-opted and one new parent governor (watch out for a separate note on this in due course).
- pupil experiences and their achievement.


Through the discussion, we question the strategies of the School Leadership Team and ensure that they have the support necessary to secure the best possible progress for all children.

COMMENCING FRIDAY 9TH NOVEMBER

In class children learn "Sama Karate" based on the style of Wado Ryu led by professional instructors with a strong emphasis on discipline, self-control, fitness, suppleness and most importantly fun.

For over 20 years the Sama Organisation has taught classes of traditional **non-contact** karate in schools to girls and boys aged four years and above. If your child would like to try karate they will need to return the consent slip to the school office and bring along the following: loose fitting clothing e.g. PE kit and payment for the lesson or payment can be made when collecting your child after the class at reception.

The cost is £5.00 per session on a **pay as you go basis** – no up-front payments! Please be aware that after an initial period of 3-4 weeks students will need to have licence and membership to train with the Sama Organisation; the combined fee is £20.00 for 1 year. Talk to your instructor for information and forms.

Any of the professional instructors will be happy to answer any questions at the class or alternatively you can contact the regional co-ordinator using the details below.

There are only 25 places available, these will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Classlist's Procedures and Processes for Data Protection Summary : March 2017

1. Classlist's new set of data protection documents are designed to comply with General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) requirements taking effect May 2018. We've taken guidance from the UK Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) and worked with top law firm VWV¹, whose Opinion showing how Classlist's procedures and processes are lawful is available on request.
2. In regulatory terms, either the PTA or school continues to act as Data Controller, engaging Classlist as a Data Processor². If the PTA is a separate entity from the school and manages parent data it is very likely to be a Data Controller. Classlist's revised Data Protection Agreement formalising the relationship must be acknowledged by a responsible person in the PTA or school. This normally happens as part of the site set-up procedure. The Agreement does not require signature.
3. If the PTA or school have contacted parents using a particular email address within the past year for PTA or school purposes, this email can lawfully be entered into Classlist, which becomes their new data processor dealing with email communications. This will fall within parents' reasonable expectations. The PTA or school should give users adequate notice of this change in case any parent objects to being invited. Mention in a newsletter; a note on the PTA or school website or noticeboard or other system regularly used to contact parents is sufficient. Where the PTA or school has not been in electronic contact with a parent, the PTA or school must keep on file evidence that the parent has consented to be contacted via email.
4. Where the PTA is data controller, it is lawful for the school, as another data controller, to assist in verifying details of new applicants against a master list. In addition at the end of each term or year, or when any relevant change occurs, the school can lawfully assist the PTA with lists of new classes and pupils in each class to ensure the Classlist database is accurate. Any personal data provided by the school must only used for verification and updating and not be for any other purpose. Any personal data sent from the school to the PTA must be transmitted using a secure, encrypted form of communication.
5. Where the school is the data controller they can lawfully engage Classlist as a new data processor and enter parent emails directly into Classlist's invitation system where this data has been used within the last year to contact parents.
6. Where a parent receives an invitation to join Classlist and decides to register, they have full control over what personal data they input and share. The only mandatory fields are name, email and child's name. If they decide not to join, it is lawful for the school or PTA (whichever is data controller) to continue to email them regular updates and other information through Classlist. Apart from their name and email, no personal data has been uploaded and no information at all is visible to other parents. They can unsubscribe from these emails at any time.
7. Members must accept the T&Cs which include strict user guidelines, and also the Privacy Notice which details how members' personal data is protected, and never passed to third parties except where this is consistent with data protection law (eg a court order).
8. Full documentation including the Privacy Notice, Terms & Conditions, Data Protection Agreement, VWV Opinion, FAQs and notes on Classlist's approach to data processing is available through Classlists's Data Protection website. We can also be contacted directly at Classlist.com.

² Where necessary (for example with a site run solely by a Class Rep, or to manage a small amount of advertising material in emails) Classlist is registered with ICO to act as a Data Controller.
