HEAD TEACHER UPDATE

I hope you all had a fantastic half term and enjoyed the cold, but beautiful weather. Mr Kelly our site manager has turned the heating on to ensure a warm welcome coming into school. The children are looking very smart in their school uniform. In the winter we expect all children to wear a tie with a white buttoned up shirt, with grey trousers, skirts or pinafores and grey or white socks/tights. Shoes should be black with buckles, velcro or laces.

ONE HUNDRED YEARS OF THE ENDING OF WW1

We are delighted to be working with one of our grandparents, Geoff Budden, who has organised for the Royal Signals Museum to lead a two day workshop at our school next week to introduce the children to communications from the 19th Century up to modern times. All the children will have an opportunity to participate with "hands on" in Morse code, codes and cyphers, using military radios and looking at radios and telephones from WW1 up to the present day.


PAYMENT DEADLINES
