Following on from an incident outside school, the police have asked us to print the following statement.

On WEDNESDAY the 11th of SEPTEMBER 2019 at approximately 15:20hrs, an incident occurred outside of the school involving a male believed to be the parent of a pupil at the school and a civil enforcement officer employed by the council. On the day in question, a parent has assaulted one of the civil enforcement officers by punching the enforcement officer in the face. Please be reminded we are a NUT FREE school. No nuts or nut products of any kind can be in school. Thank you for your co operation.

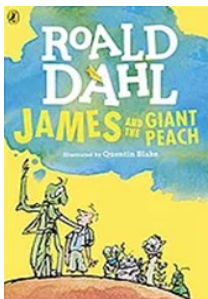
ILLNESSES
