


	<p><u>Wonder – R.J. Palacio</u></p> <p>Auggie wants to be an ordinary ten-year-old. He does ordinary things - eating ice cream, playing on his Xbox. He <i>feels</i> ordinary - inside. But ordinary kids don't make other ordinary kids run away screaming in playgrounds. Ordinary kids aren't stared at wherever they go.</p> <p>Born with a terrible facial abnormality, Auggie has been home-schooled by his parents his whole life. Now, for the first time, he's being sent to a real school - and he's dreading it. All he wants is to be accepted - but can he convince his new classmates that he's just like them, underneath it all?</p>	
	<p><u>Cogheart – Peter Bunzl</u></p> <p>Lily's life is in mortal peril. Her father is missing and now silver-eyed men stalk her through the shadows. What could they want from her?</p> <p>With her friends - Robert, the clockmaker's son, and Malkin, her mechanical fox - Lily is plunged into a murky and menacing world. Too soon Lily realizes that those she holds dear may be the very ones to break her heart...</p> <p>Murder, mayhem and mystery meet in this gripping Victorian adventure.</p>	
	<p><i>Can a birdwatcher outwit an escaped convict?</i></p> <p>Twitch has three pet chickens, four pigeons, swallows nesting in his bedroom and a passion for birdwatching. On the first day of the summer holidays, he arrives at his secret hide to find police everywhere: a convicted robber has broken out of prison and is hiding in Aves Wood. Can Twitch use his talents for birdwatching to hunt for the dangerous prisoner and find the missing loot?</p>	
	<p><u>The Last Wild – Piers Torday</u></p> <p>This is a story about a boy named Kester. He is extraordinary, but he doesn't know that yet. All he knows, at this very moment, is this:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. There is a flock of excited pigeons in his bedroom.</li> <li>2. They are talking to him.</li> <li>3. His life will never be quite the same again...</li> </ol>	



	<p><u>The House With Chicken Legs – Sophie Anderson</u></p> <p>Marinka dreams of a normal life, where her house stays in one place long enough for her to make friends. But her house has chicken legs and moves on without warning. For Marinka's grandmother is Baba Yaga, who guides spirits between this world and the next. Marinka longs to change her destiny and sets out to break free from her grandmother's footsteps, but her house has other ideas...</p>	
	<p><u>The Island at the end of everything – Kiran Millwood - Hargrave</u></p> <p>Amihan lives on Cullion Island, where some of the inhabitants – including her mother – have leprosy.</p> <p>Ami loves her home – with its blue seas and lush forests, Cullion is all she has ever known. But the arrival of malicious government official Mr Zamora changes her world forever: islanders untouched by sickness are forced to leave. Banished across the sea, she's desperate to return, and finds a strange and fragile hope in a colony of butterflies. Can they lead her home before it's too late?</p>	
	<p><u>The Boy Who Sailed The Ocean In An Armchair – Lara Williamson</u></p> <p>Becket Rumsey is all at sea. His dad has run away with him and his brother Billy in the middle of the night. And they've left everything behind, including their almost-mum Pearl. Becket has no idea what's going on - it's a mystery. So with the help of Billy and a snail called Brian, Becket sets out on a journey of discovery. It's not plain sailing but then what journeys ever are? An extraordinary story of courage, dreams and finding your way.</p>	
	<p><u>Tin – Pádraig Kenny</u></p> <p>Christopher is 'Proper': a real boy with a real soul, orphaned in a fire. He works for an engineer, a maker of the eccentric, loyal and totally individual mechanicals who are Christopher's best friends. But after a devastating accident, a secret is revealed and Christopher's world is changed for ever ... What follows is a remarkable adventure, as Christopher discovers who he really is, and what it means to be human.</p>	

	<p><b>Some mature content – suitable for advanced readers of 12+</b></p> <p>Set in a dark vision of the near future, a terrifying reality TV show is taking place. Twelve boys and twelve girls are forced to appear in a live event called <i>The Hunger Games</i>.</p> <p><b>There is only one rule: kill or be killed.</b> When sixteen-year-old Katniss Everdeen steps forward to take her younger sister's place in the games, she sees it as a death sentence. But Katniss has been close to death before. For her, survival is second nature.</p>	
	<p><u>The Maze Runner – James Dashner</u></p> <p>When the doors of the lift crank open, the only thing Thomas remembers is his first name. But he's not alone. He's surrounded by boys who welcome him to the Glade - a walled encampment at the centre of a bizarre and terrible stone maze.</p> <p>Like Thomas, the Gladers don't know why or how they came to be there - or what's happened to the world outside. All they know is that every morning when the walls slide back, they will risk everything - even the Grievers, half-machine, half-animal horror that patrol its corridors, to try and find out.</p> <p>*Some mature content – suitable for advanced readers of 12+</p>	
	<p><u>Goodnight Mister Tom – Michelle Magorian</u></p> <p>Young Willie Beech is evacuated to the country as Britain stands on the brink of the Second World War. A sad, deprived child, he slowly begins to flourish under the care of old Tom Oakley - but his new-found happiness is shattered by a summons from his mother back in London . . .</p>	
	<p><u>Pax – Sara Pennypacker</u></p> <p>Pax was only a kit when his family was killed and he was rescued by 'his boy', Peter. Now the country is at war and when his father enlists, Peter has no choice but to move in with his grandfather. Far worse than leaving home is the fact that he has to leave Pax behind. But before Peter spends even one night under his grandfather's roof he sneaks out into the night, determined to find his beloved friend. This is the story of Peter, Pax, and their journeys back to each other as war rampages throughout the country.</p>	

	<p><u>Goth Girl – Chris Riddell</u></p> <p>Ada Goth is the only child of Lord Goth. The two live together in the enormous Ghastly-Gorm Hall. Lord Goth believes that children should be heard and not seen, so Ada has to wear large clumpy boots so that he can always hear her coming. This makes it hard for her to make friends and, if she's honest, she's rather lonely. Then one day William and Emily Cabbage come to stay at the house and, together with a ghostly mouse called Ishmael, the three children begin to unravel a dastardly plot that Maltravers, the mysterious indoor gamekeeper, is hatching.</p>	
	<p><u>What Not to Do When You're Invisible – Ross Welford</u></p> <p>Turning invisible at will: it's one way of curing your acne. But far more drastic than 13 year-old Ethel Leatherhead intended when she tried a combination of untested medicines and a sunbed. It's fun at first, being invisible. And aided by her friend Boydy, she manages to keep her extraordinary ability secret. Or does she...? When one day the invisibility fails to wear off, Ethel is thrown into a nightmare of lies and deception as she struggles to keep herself safe</p>	
	<p><u>Kick – Mitch Johnson</u></p> <p>Budi's plan is simple. He's going to be a star. Budi's going to play for the greatest team on earth, instead of sweating over each stitch he sews, each football boot he makes. But one unlucky kick brings Budi's world crashing down. Now he owes the Dragon, the most dangerous man in Jakarta. Soon it isn't only Budi's dreams at stake, but his life. A story about dreaming big, about hope and heroes, and never letting anything stand in your way.</p>	
	<p><u>The Light Jar – by Lisa Thompson</u></p> <p>Nate and his mother are running away, hiding out in a tumbledown cottage in the middle of a forest. When Mum heads off for provisions, and then doesn't return, Nate is left alone and afraid, with the dark closing in all around him. But comfort can come from the most unexpected of places - a mysterious girl trying to solve the clues of a treasure hunt and the reappearance of an old friend from his past. Will Nate find the bravery needed to face the troubles of his present and ultimately illuminate the future? A story of fear and hope, loneliness and friendship - full of the heart, engaging characters and propulsive, page-turning mystery.</p>	

	<p><u>The Dream Snatcher – Abi Elphinstone</u>  Twelve-year-old <b>Moll Pecksniff</b> wakes one night in the middle of the forest, lured there by a recurring nightmare - the one with the drums and the rattles and the masks. <b>The Dreamsnatcher</b> is waiting. He has already taken her dreams and now he wants her life.</p> <p>Because Moll is more important than she knows... The Oracle Bones foretold that she and <b>Gryff</b>, a wildcat that has always been by her side, are the only ones who can fight back against the Dreamsnatcher's dark magic. Suddenly everything is at stake, and Moll is drawn into a world full of secrets, magic and adventure.</p>	
	<p><u>The Hobbit – J.R.R. Tolkien</u></p> <p>A timeless classic.</p> <p>Bilbo Baggins enjoys a quiet and contented life, with no desire to travel far from the comforts of home; then one day the wizard Gandalf and a band of dwarves arrive unexpectedly and enlist his services – as a burglar – on a dangerous expedition to raid the treasure-hoard of Smaug the dragon. Bilbo's life is never to be the same again.</p>	
	<p><u>Running On The Roof Of The World – Jess Butterworth</u>  <i>There are two words that are banned in Tibet. Two words that can get you locked in prison without a second thought. I watch the soldiers tramping away and call the words after them.</i>  <i>'Dalai Lama.'</i></p> <p>Tash has to follow many rules to survive in Tibet, a country occupied by Chinese soldiers. But when a man sets himself on fire in protest and soldiers seize Tash's parents, she and her best friend Sam must break the rules. They are determined to escape Tibet - and seek the help of the Dalai Lama himself in India.</p>	
	<p>In a dangerous future, huge motorized cities hunt, attack and fight each other for survival.</p> <p>As London pursues a small town, young apprentice Tom is flung out into the wastelands, where a terrifying cyborg begins to hunt him down.</p>	

	<p><u>Marcus Sedgwick – Floodland</u>  Imagine that a few years from now England is covered by water, and Norwich is an island. Zoe, left behind in the confusion when her parents escaped, survives there as best she can. Alone and desperate among marauding gangs, she manages to dig a derelict boat out of the mud and gets away to Eels Island. But Eels Island, whose raggle-taggle inhabitants are dominated by the strange boy Dooby, is full of danger too. The belief that she will one day find her parents spurs Zoe on to a dramatic escape in a story of courage and determination that is handled with warmth and humanity</p>	
	<p><i>Once</i> by Morris Gleitzman is the story of a young Jewish boy who is determined to escape the orphanage he lives in to save his Jewish parents from the Nazis in the occupied Poland of the Second World War.</p> <p><b>Everybody deserves to have something good in their life. At least Once.</b></p>	
	<p><u>Tell Me No Lies – Malorie Blackman</u>  Gemma longs for her lost mother, taking comfort from the cuttings in her scrapbook; pictures of mothers who loved their children come what may.</p> <p>Mike is new to the area; a boy with a terrible secret to hide. A secret about his missing mother.</p> <p>Gemma and Mike - two kids hurt by their past and now inextricably linked. Their effect on each other's lives will be explosive.</p>	
	<p><u>Oranges In No Man's Land – Elizabeth Laird</u>  Since her father left Lebanon to find work and her mother tragically died in a shell attack, ten-year-old Ayesha has been living in the bomb-ravaged city of Beirut with her granny and her two younger brothers. The city has been torn in half by civil war and a desolate, dangerous no man's land divides the two sides. Only militiamen and tanks dare enter this deadly zone, but when Granny falls desperately ill, Ayesha sets off on a terrifying journey to reach a doctor living in enemy territory.</p>	

	<p><u>Millions –The Not So Great Train Robbery – Frank Cottrell Boyce</u></p> <p>Two brothers, Damian and Anthony, are unwittingly caught up in a train robbery during Britain's countdown to joining the Euro. Suddenly finding themselves with a vast amount of cash, the boys have just one glorious, appalling dilemma – how to spend it in the few days before it becomes worthless. Torn between the vices of buying a million pizzas and the virtues of ending world poverty, the boys soon discover that being rich is a mug's game. For not only is the clock ticking – the bungling bank robbers are closing in too.</p>	
	<p><u>Boy Underwater –Adam Barron</u></p> <p>Cymbeline Igloo (yes, really!) has NEVER been swimming - Not ever. Not once. But how hard can it be? He's Googled front crawl and he's found his dad's old pair of trunks. He's totally ready.</p> <p>What he's not ready for is the accident at the pool – or how it leads his mum to a sudden breakdown.</p> <p>Now, with the help of friends old and new, Cymbeline must solve the mystery of why his mum never took him near water – and it will turn his whole life upside down...</p>
