

General Information


- Library will be once a week Monday afternoon.

If a child has chosen to break a school rule, they will be given a warning; if repeated, there will be an appropriate sanction.


Behaviour: Traffic Light System

<u>Rewards</u>

- Children also receive verbal praise, Star of the day, Hundred Square points, get to share work amongst the year group, weekly wizard and ASCENT.
