# **Respectful Reminder for parents and carers:**

#### The whole school site is a non-smoking zone

Please do not smoke or vape on any part of the site - including the tunnel into school

#### Scooters, bikes and wheeled toys

Please ensure that ANY scooters, bicycles or wheeled toys brought into school are pushed and not ridden when entering or leaving the school premises. This is to avoid anyone getting knocked over, particularly small children and more vulnerable adults who are also dropping off or collecting children.

If your child is leaving their bike or scooter in school, this must be padlocked up to the mushrooms by the shelter in the large playground, or in the bike shelter in the small playground.

#### Man Hunt and Team It Games

Man Hunt and Team It Games are not allowed at school. The reason these type of games are banned is due to the nature of them. They result in children becoming a large group against very few individuals and often just one person against the rest of the team. This has resulted in extremely unkind behaviours and children 'ganging up' on others and sometimes has caused the game to become aggressive in nature with children getting hurt. We encourage the use of kind hands and feet at Hill View, and these games do not support the messages we are giving to children at school.



# <u> Journey to Jo'burg – Beverley Naidoo</u>



This is the story of love, commitment and the flowering of the human spirit against the background of South Africa's apartheid.
Frightened that their baby sister Dineo will die, thirteen-year-old Naledi and her younger brother Tiro run away from their grandmother to Johannesburg to find their mother, who works there as a maid. Their journey illustrates at every turn the grim realities of apartheid - the pass laws, bantustans, racism, the breakdown of family life. The opulence of the white "Madam's" house contrasts starkly with the reality that Naledi and Tiro face - that their baby sister is suffering from starvation, not an incurable disease.
