## Rucksacks

Please can children either bring in a book bag or small rucksack, but not both.



From September, rucksacks must not be any bigger than 36cm in height and 27cm width. This enables your child's coat, hat/scarves plus ruck sack to fit in snugly with the door closed to avoid any unsafe hazards for children walking past.

Please bear in mind the reception classes can only have book bags as there is no room to hang ruck sacks with coats etc

## Summer Fire Hazards



You may be aware we have had a number of fires started on the heathlands and other open areas in Bournemouth and Poole recently. With the warmer weather forecast over the coming week we want to make sure you and your child/ren are safe.

Please talk to your child about how to stay safe:

If they see a fire, walk carefully away, tell an adult and ask them to call 999 (please consider downloading what3words to give an accurate location)

Never play with matches or lighters

Do not have campfires or disposable BBQs on the heathland and open areas.

If your child is concerned about the fires, please reassure them that the firefighters are working hard to put the fires out and keep them safe.

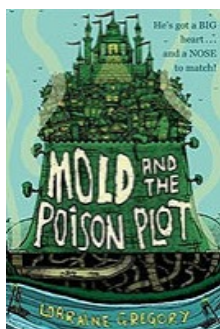
