Hot School Meals

From September 2023, the cost of a Hot School Lunch will be £2.60 each day. If your child is in Year R, Year 1 and Year 2 they are eligible for a Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM).

Orders must be made by midnight on Mondays for the following week ahead.

Alternatively, you can order meals for the whole term in advance.

If no selection/order is made, then you will need to provide your child with a packed lunch from home.

We do not have spare lunches delivered into school to cover anyone that has forgotten.

Please remember we are a nut free school (this includes most chocolate spreads) and we promote healthy eating. Please see the attached menu for the autumn term.

Parking & Road Safety for drop of and collection

Please be mindful of safety on the roads when dropping off and collection children.

Vehicles must be parked appropriately in the correct places, not on zig zag lines, chevrons, pavements or blocking driveways. Please also remember that the disabled parking spaces are for vehicles with drivers/passengers with a valid Blue Badge.



Rail Safety Week


Following on from Rail Safety Week last week, please help to keep your child/ children safe around the rail network by sharing these 3 messages:

- Being on the railway tracks is extremely dangerous
- 2. Trains can run at any time of day or night, even when not shown in the timetable, or on station information displays, or online.
- 3. On the Wessex and South Western Railway network trains are powered by a 'third rail' which carries 750v of electricity. This is always live, even when there are no trains running.
