Boom Reader- why books are like sharks!

I am pleased to report that our adoption of the Boom Reader digital reading record is going really well. It is being used by Teachers and staff across the school to record pages read and many of our older pupils are logging their own reading too. It is our expectation that children read at least 5 times a week at home. Again, older children can do this independently and log their own reading, but it is really important that our younger children have an adult to share a book with to practise their reading. This is something that you can really do to help your child make a success of school because learning to read, enjoying reading and using reading across all aspects of the curriculum is such an important foundation for everything.

If your child has a RWI paper book or a home reader then you can log pages your child has read to you but you can also record if you have been sharing a bedtime read or are reading a longer novel to your child. The research shows that the most successful readers are those that see the adults around them reading so if your child sees you enjoying a book then this is educational too!

Books are an ideal technology, so it is important to have a break from reading on a screen.

Neil Gaman said that his friend Douglas Adams once said, when asked if books would become obsolete or replaced by screens:

"Books are sharks... because sharks have been around for a very long time. There were sharks before there were dinosaurs, and the reason sharks are still in the ocean is that nothing is better at being a shark than a shark." 'Look at a book. A book is the right size to be a book. They're solar-powered. If you drop them, they keep on being a book. You can find your place in microseconds. Books are really good at being books and no matter what happens books will survive." Douglas Adams

Enjoying a book and reading with your child builds memories and happy times that your child/ children will go onto share with their own children. It is an investment in their future and future generations.


A note on Handwriting





