<u>A 'Hello' from Miss Steele:</u>

I'd like to take this opportunity to introduce myself- I'm excited to have joined the Year 4 team at Hill View. I have taken on the role as Class Teacher for Johnson class and Head of Year 4. I have recently moved from teaching in Qatar for the past 6 years and I hope that my international experience will benefit the year group and give me lots of wonderful stories to share.

Year 4 spent the first half of the autumn term learning about Ancient Egypt, and in our topic 'Toot and Come in' we learned about Howard Carter and how they discovered Tutankhamun's tomb. Through reading a diary extract and looking at the techniques of diary writing, we wrote diary entries from the viewpoint of people living in the desert and in the city during Ancient Egyptian times.

In Maths we built on our rounding skills and place value knowledge. Within our Science learning we looked at the life cycle of a bee and learned more about why bees are important.

Through our Design and Technology work, we designed a decorative belt that would have been worn during Ancient Egyptian times and learnt how to use the running and whip stitch to sew the material together and add decoration.

I look forward to getting to know the children across year 4 throughout the year, creating lots of fun learning opportunities along the way and supporting them with their pastoral and academic progress.

Recommended Read Book of the week (Y4)


Alex Sparrow And The Really Big Stink – Jennifer Killick




