

Year 6 Update

In the last half term, Year 6 became keen scientists in our Mr Nobody project. The children enjoyed learning about Charles Darwin and his theory of evolution and adaptation. We have also finished reading David Almond's novel - Skellig and this resulted in some fantastic vocabulary in their narrative writing.

This term, Year 6 have become budding historians in our new project, 'The Curse of the Maya.' We investigated a series of clues about the lost city of Tikal and we have started to compare the Ancient Maya civilisation to life in the Central America region today. Children have been fascinated to discover more about the Maya ball game, known as Pitz, and in particular, the consequences for losing this brutal game! They have started to draft an explanation text about the ball game, and it has been great to see their enthusiasm for writing as historians.

Additionally, it has been great to see the children be inspired to create their own healthy tortilla, similar to those that Maya people would have made. We are looking forward to baking these in the next few weeks.



Road Safety



We have recently received several complaints from parents and residents regarding parking and road safety at drop off and pick up times. Dangerous parking is an increasing issue around schools, putting the safety of children and others at risk. Parking on zig-zag lines or pedestrian crossings can cause visibility issues to drivers and people walking the pavements alike.

Drivers should not park near a school entrance

This also includes anywhere that prevents access for emergency services, at or near a bus stop, opposite or within 10 metres of a junction, over a dropped kerb, and in front of an entrance to a property.

Drivers should not park on yellow zig-zag lines

These lines indicate the length of the road where stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited. Where there is an upright sign, there is a mandatory prohibition of stopping and/or waiting during the times shown. Yellow zig zag lines without signs do not have a Traffic Regulation Order and therefore, are not legally enforceable.

Drivers should not park on white zig-zag lines

Unlike yellow zig-zag lines, white zig-zag lines are enforced by local authorities and the police, and prohibit stopping or waiting even in the presence of a sign.

Drivers should not park on double yellow lines

Stopping or waiting on a double yellow line is strictly prohibited. Double yellow lines prevent vehicle owners from parking or waiting in this area at any time.

Drivers should not park on single yellow lines at certain times

Single yellow lines prohibit parking during specific times. A nearby sign will indicate the times in which vehicle owners are allowed to park on single yellow lines.

We have received a generous number of toys for this year's toy appeal helping support The Salvation Army.




