- · 250g <u>plain flour</u>, plus a little more for dusting
- · 2 tbsp vegetable oil
- ½ tsp fine salt

The children have decided, in school, what extra ingredients they would ideally like to include in their tortilla. Please provide your child with the ingredients they wish to add to this basic recipe above. If your child has any intolerances, could you kindly provide the necessary alternative ingredients. Some ingredients may need to be pre-cooked and it is essential that this is done at home. We do not have the facilities to pre-cook ingredients before they go into the tortilla (e.g. roasted vegetables, bacon, sausage, egg etc.)


