What a brilliant start to 2024 it has been! There have been some very exciting activities happening in year 2 since we came back after the holidays, from finding a suitcase from the Titanic, to going on a brilliant trip to the Sea City museum in Southampton.

The children have thrown themselves into being historians, learning all about the Titanic, its crew and passengers and the reasons why it sank. They have asked some amazing questions to deepen their understanding and have thought about different scenarios as to how the sinking of the Titanic could have been prevented.













The trip to the museum developed the children's knowledge and gave them some real-life insights into what life was like on the Titanic. We met some of the passengers who had travelled on it's maiden voyage to New York, tested how many compartments could have been filled without the Titanic sinking and smelt what it was like in different areas of the Titanic. Can you guess what room the children were smelling in the picture? Clue = somewhere you sweat!

Thank you so much to the parent helpers for the trip. We couldn't do it without you and really appreciate you taking the time out of your day to support us.

We are looking forward seeing all the home learning in our outcome of our very own Year 2 Titanic museum which will be held in the Year 2 classrooms on Thursday 8th February at 3.30pm.



The children come into school in their uniform but bring in a small photo of something or someone who makes them feel good and who they feel they can trust and talk to at home.


Thursday 8th February
