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
Year 3 Update



Number Day Competition Time for KS2!



As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, we are taking part in a friendly competition involving schools in the United Kingdom for NSPCC Number Day. The competition runs from 07:30 to 19:30 GMT on Friday 2nd February. It's all done online via <u>play.ttrockstars.com</u>.

Children can play in any game mode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a 60minute limit (see below). Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

To support player well-being, there is a daily time limit of 60 minutes per player. Once the player goes beyond 60 minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf, but by all means, encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high stress levels or impact on family plans. Parentkind.org

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





Umbrella group autism talks and workshops coming up




The next Umbrella group coffee morning for parents and carers of children with autism is on Saturday 27 January from 10am to 12.30pm at Portfield School.
