# The Hill View Sandwich Bar 

(6 weeks)

## Rationale/ Intent

After being challenged to provide teachers with a nutritional, heathy lunch, children will research different types of sandwiches and fillings. They will design an appealing sandwich after completing market research about what the staff enjoy. Children will then create a product based on a class design criteria and communicate their ideas through talking and drawing. All children will use a range of tools to spread, cut and grate fillings, in addition to understanding and demonstrating how to use tools safely. All children will understand the basic principles of cleanliness when preparing food. Alongside this, they will understand where different types of food comes from and they will explore seasonal foods. As successful scientists the children will describe how the weather helps the growth of foods. Throughout the process they will evaluate their product against the class design criteria.

Hook
The headteacher is unhappy about what the teachers are eating. They are challenged to educate the teachers about healthy eating and encourage them try new healthy foods.

## Outcome

Hill View sandwich Bar - The children will feed the teachers by providing a nutritious, healthy lunch to get them through the rest of the day.

Visits and Visitors

Cultural capital; Maths

- Sort, count and tally teachers' responses and represent as a simple pictogram.
- Cut shapes (representing sandwiches e.g into squares, rectangles, triangles) learning halves and quarters, recognizing the language of 'equal'.
Price sandwiches using multiples of 10, giving change from $£ 1$.
ICT - Use iPads to take photographs of adverts/ signs and displays around the school. Use the zoom features. Use iPads and Purple Mash (2Count) to record preferences to fillings.

Role Play - Sandwich Bar - till, opportunities to practice cutting (clay/play dough, plastic knives), labels for sandwiches, plastic food, pots for ingredients, charts detailing what is healthy and where the food comes from, menus, pricing, order forms, design areas, rectangles, squares, etc - mathematical shapes, serviettes, table and table cloth, plates, cutlery, hair nets, gloves, blue tape, pretend hand wash, display shelves, cling film/sandwich bags

Design and make a healthy sandwich for a member of your family, recording this in photographs, pictures, captions and simple sentences. Bring in for display in the Hill View Sandwich Bar.
