Year 6 Update

In the last half term, Year 6 became budding Scientists in the project, Have a Heart. It was great to see the children enjoying learning about the circulatory system and the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function. Using what they had learnt in Science, in groups, the children planned and led a warmup and sports activity for the Year 5 children. Children used their fantastic collaboration skills within these groups to communicate ideas and organise teams and equipment. We were very impressed with how confidently the Year 6 children offered encouragement and feedback to each other and were able to reflect on how the learning intention had been met.



In the past few weeks, we have investigated and explored Ancient Greece. The children have enjoyed sequencing key events and they have started to compare Modern Greece and Ancient Greece. It has been great to see Year 6 enjoying reading Greek Myths and designing their own Pandora's box too.

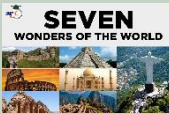

Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility. That's why the NSPCC launched their new campaign, [Listen up, Speak up](#). They are asking the public to take free, 10-minute digital training and learn how to **listen up** and **speak up** for children. The NSPCC is offering free 10-minute digital training and learn what to do if you're ever worried about a child or their family.

Listen up, Speak up will show you:

- some signs a child might be at risk, and steps you can take to help
- how to approach difficult conversations to help keep children safe
- who you can contact if you're ever concerned about a child or their family.

Attendance - Lates

Did you know that the school gates close at 8:50 in the morning? This is also when the register is taken, so if your child arrives later, then they will receive a Late mark on the register. If your child arrives after 9:20 a.m. then this will be marked as an unauthorised absence on the register. We begin learning straight away in the classroom; if late, children could be missing an intervention specifically for them, or some time to practice a skill such as phonics, spellings or times tables, or a whole class input on the learning they will be doing that morning.

Dogs on the premises

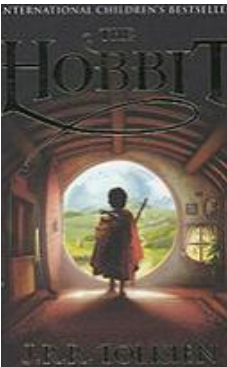
Please can we remind parents and carers that dogs are not allowed on the school premises. This is due to the health, safety and welfare of children and adults.
