Personal, Social & Emotional Development

We will be learning to be empathetic by thinking about some of the characters from traditional tales, and how they might be feeling at different parts of the story. We will 'hot seat' some characters to see if we can understand how the feel at different points of the story. We will also be thinking about how we can be our best and keep a healthy mind.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be designing and making wooden spoon puppets using our favourite fairy-tale character as inspiration. We will think carefully about the design, how to make our puppet and evaluate our final product. Finally, we will carefully paint a fairy tale character of our choice, using watercolours.

Communication and Language & Literacy

We will be reading lots of traditional tales and creating story maps to aid our retelling of them. We will also be thinking about how to describe characters using adjectives and continuing to embed our use of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

Finally, we will bring our findings with us to the fairy-tale ball and each class will share their findings and help the fairy god-mother!
