If leaving a message or sending an e-mail, please give the following information:Child's name, Class/Year Group


Reason for Absence— We are required to record specific details rather than just "unwell". Please let us know your child's specific symptoms e.g. temperature, cold/flu symptoms, vomiting etc. Providing these details will prevent us calling you.

Please refer to the <u>NHS website</u> for advice regarding whether to keep your child away from school if they are unwell.

## School Census Day

The amount of funding a school receives increases in line with the number of eligible pupils taking a free school meal on Census Day. To help Hill View Primary receive the full funding that we are entitled to, please order your child a hot school meal on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May. The deadline for ordering online through Forerunner will be midnight on Monday 6th May.

## **Private Fostering**

Are you looking after someone else's child?

Is your child living with someone else?

Private Fostering is when a child under the age of 16 (18 if disabled) is cared for by someone who is NOT their parent or close relative, for 28 days or more. This is a private arrangement made between a parent and a carer. Close relatives are defined as step-parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters, uncles or aunts.

#### The role of Children's Social Care

A social worker will be allocated to both the carer and the child/ young person, to ensure that the arrangement is meeting the needs of the child/ young person.

Caring for someone else's child can be challenging. The Private Fostering Team will be able to provide advice as required throughout the arrangement.

It is a criminal offence to fail to notify the local authority of a private fostering arrangement.


Ellis was given three books and a Buckingham Palace chocolate coin. He described meeting the royal couple as "very exciting".
