



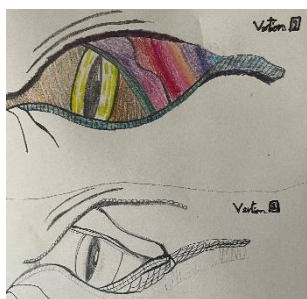

Pupil Absence

Reporting an absence.



If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school office:

If leaving a message or sending an e-mail, please give the child's name & Class/Year Group. We are required to record the **Reason for their Absence**. We need specific details rather than just "unwell". **Please let us know your child's specific symptoms** e.g. temperature, cold/flu symptoms, vomiting etc. Providing these details will prevent us calling you.

Please refer to the [NHS website](https://www.nhs.uk) for advice regarding whether to keep your child away from school if they are unwell.

Head Lice



Please can we kindly ask parents to regularly check children's hair for lice, and promptly treat any cases. We have been informed about a couple of isolated cases within school.

Please can we also remind you that it is not necessary to keep children away from school if they have, or have been recently treated for headlice.

Warmer Weather

Now that the sun is finally here, please can we ask that children arrive in school with suncream already applied. Due to some children in school having allergies, as with other medicines, creams, lip balms etc, children should not have any suncream in their bags or lockers. Please speak to your child's class teacher if they have particularly sensitive or sunburn prone skin as they may be able to safely store suncream for them to reapply at lunchtime if required.

Please ensure that children have a named refillable water bottle with them every day. Please also check that any hats or sunglasses brought into school are clearly labelled with your child's name so that lost items can be promptly returned.

Sun Safety Code

Spending too much time in the sun can be harmful.

We should all follow a special code which reminds us how to enjoy the sun whilst staying safe.

There are five parts to remember...

- S**pend time in the shade between 11am and 3pm.
- M**ake sure you never burn.
- A**im to cover up with a hat, t-shirt and sunglasses.
- R**emember children need to take extra care.
- T**hen use sunscreen of a minimum of SPF 30.

Aim to Cover up with a T-Shirt, Hat and Sunglasses

- A hat with a wide brim will shade your face and neck.
- Sunglasses can help to protect your eyes from UV rays.
- Covering up with a T-shirt is a good way to protect your shoulders and upper arms.

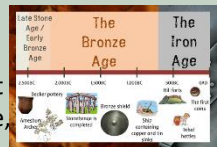
