Please find below an overview of the unit which will be taught throughout the last term of school.

Lesson name:	Lesson Overview:
Healthy me	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand that the body gets energy from food, water and air (oxygen); • Recognise that exercise and sleep are important parts of a healthy lifestyle.
Then and now	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify things they could do as a baby, a toddler and can do now; • Identify the people who help/helped them at those different stages.
Taking care of a baby	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand some of the tasks required to look after a baby; • Explain how to meet the basic needs of a baby, for example, eye contact, cuddling, washing, changing, feeding.
Who can help? (2)	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain the difference between teasing and bullying; • Give examples of what they can do if they experience or witness bullying; • Say who they could get help from in a bullying situation.
Surprises and secrets	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain the difference between a secret and a nice surprise; • Identify situations as being secrets or surprises; • Identify who they can talk to if they feel uncomfortable about any secret they are told, or told to keep.
Keeping	<p>Children will be able to:</p>

privates private	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identify parts of the body that are private;• Describe ways in which private parts can be kept private;• Identify people they can talk to about their private parts.
