Please find below an overview of the unit which will be taught throughout the last term of school.

Lesson name:	Lesson Overview:
A helping hand	Children will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Demonstrate simple ways of giving positive feedback to others.</li> </ul>
Sam moves away	Children will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Recognise the range of feelings that are associated with losing (and being reunited) with a person they are close to.</li> </ul>
Haven't you grown!	Children will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify different stages of growth (e.g. baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult);</li> <li>Understand and describe some of the things that people are capable of at these different stages.</li> </ul>
My body, your body	Children will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify which parts of the human body are private;</li> <li>Explain that a person's genitals help them to make babies when they are grown up;</li> <li>Understand that humans mostly have the same body parts but that they can look different from person to person.</li> </ul>
Respecting privacy	Children will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Explain what privacy means;</li> <li>Know that you are not allowed to touch someone's private belongings without their permission;</li> <li>Give examples of different types of private information.</li> </ul>
Some secrets should never	Children will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify how inappropriate touch can make someone feel;</li> </ul>

be kept	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Understand that there are unsafe secrets and secrets that are nice surprises;</li><li>• Explain that if someone is being touched in a way that they don't like they have to tell someone in their safety network so they can help it stop.</li></ul>
