Please find below an overview of the unit which will be taught throughout the last term of school.

Lesson name:	Lesson Overview:
Relationship Tree	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify different types of relationships; Recognise who they have positive healthy relationships with.
Body space	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand what is meant by the term body space (or personal space); Identify when it is appropriate or inappropriate to allow someone into their body space; Rehearse strategies for when someone is inappropriately in their body space.
None of your business!	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Know that our body can often give us a sign when something doesn't feel right; to trust these signs and talk to a trusted adult if this happens; Recognise and describe appropriate behaviour online as well as offline; Identify what constitutes personal information and when it is not appropriate or safe to share this; Understand and explain how to get help in a situation where requests for images or information of themselves or others occurs.
Secret or surprise?	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Define the terms 'secret' and 'surprise' and know the difference between a safe and an unsafe secret; Recognise how different surprises and secrets might make them

	<p>feel;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know who they could ask for help if a secret made them feel uncomfortable or unsafe.
My changing body	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognise that babies come from the joining of an egg and sperm; • Explain what happens when an egg doesn't meet a sperm; • Understand that for girls, periods are a normal part of puberty.
Basic first aid	<p>Children will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know how to make a clear and efficient call to emergency services if necessary. • Have concepts of basic first-aid, for example dealing with common injuries, including head injuries.
