Please find below an overview of the unit which will be taught throughout the last term of school.

Lesson name:	Lesson Overview:
Seasons	 Children will be able to: Name the different seasons and describe their differences.
	 Explain the changes that occur as seasons change.
	 Talk about how they have grown in resilience.
Life stages - plants, animals, humans	 Children will be able to: To understand that animals and humans change in appearance over time.
	 Use relevant vocabulary such as egg, seed, baby, grow, change, old, young (and the names for young animals).
	 Make observations and ask questions about living things.
Life Stages: Human life	Children will be able to:Retell a story and respond to questions about it.
stage - who will I be?	 Use the language and describe the different life stages of: baby, child, teenager, adult, older age.
	 Talk about their own experience of growing up.
Where do babies come from?	 Children will be able to: Explain that a baby is made by a woman and a man, and grows inside a mother's tummy.
	 Understand that every family is different.
	 Talk about similarities and differences between themselves and others.
Getting bigger	Children will be able to:Talk about how they have changed as they have grown.
	• Explain the differences between babies, children, and adults.
