Costume list

Narrators, Mayor, teacher – Smart casual clothes

Gilda – Skirt/trousers, blouse and turned up plaits in hair.

Tommy – Plain clothes with leather/denim jacket (rock star look)

Gawaine – Dragon costume

Villagers, oompah band leader – Shorts/skirts, plain blouse or t-shirt, shawl and knee high socks.

Crones – Witches outfits

Boys and girls – Plain clothes

Butcher – white apron

Baker – apron, bakers hat

Clock maker – shirt and waistcoat

Plumber – overalls

Builder – hard hat, jeans and t-shirt

Gardener – green casual clothes, gardening gloves

Doctor – white coat

Cuckoo clock – brown outfit. Cardboard clock face mask.

Farmers – checked shirt, jeans and wellies

Skaters – glittery clothing or outdoor winter gear, cardboard skates around necks

Old man – knitted cardigan, flat cap

Agents – all black outfit and sunglasses

Ninja warrior – black outfit with ninja mask

Fire brigade – fireman's costume

Trainer – gym gear

Cheerleaders – cheerleader outfit

Goats – brown/grey outfits and goat mask/ears
