## As Engineers the children will be:

- Using research to develop design criteria for a cam toy, selecting appropriate materials.
- Understand and use mechanical systems in their products (cams).
- Create a moving toy which includes a cam function with a WW2 theme.

## As Writers the children will be:

- Developing their use of formal language and grammatical structure.
- Developing their range of sentence structure and punctuation.

This will be demonstrated in a letter as an evacuee and historical narrative writing.

## For Home Learning the children can:

*Investigate their own line of enquiry about the war based on an area of personal interest. For example: fashion, food, weapons, a specific battle etc.*

*Create a PowerPoint or a poster to share your findings with your class by Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July 2024.*

## As Historians the children will be:

- Researching and understanding when World War II started and why, focusing on events in chronological order.
- Develop an understanding of who Hitler was and his influence during WWII
- Learning about key events from the war, including: The Blitz, the evacuation process and what life in Britain was like during the war.
- Learning about the end of World War II and how people celebrated the end of the war.
