On Wednesday, EYFS and KS1 had their HVGT final, and it was a final to remember!

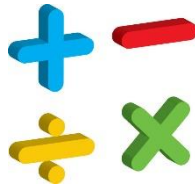
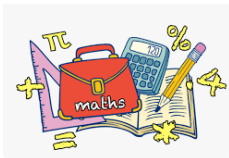

## Your Child's Phone

Please can we politely remind parents to continue to monitor their child's phone regularly. We have had further reports of children using foul, abusive language and being very unkind to each other, both via text and through other messaging apps. Please remember that you can block specific people, and that apps such as WhatsApp, Messenger, Instagram and Snapchat all have minimum age agreements attached to them.

As part of the school's computing & PSHE curriculum and in assemblies, children regularly receive teaching and information about the safe use of the internet to support them in the wider world.

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## Forerunner (Hot school lunches)

As you will be aware our Hot School Meal provider is Forerunner. Please [click here for their website](#) . If you have not yet registered with them, please do by [clicking here](#). If you do not register, you will not be able to order meals for your child/children.

There is a choice of meals every day. Please [click here to view the Autumn Term Menu](#) for our return in September.

From September 2024, the cost of a Hot School Meal will be **£2.65** each day. If your child is in Year R, Year 1 and Year 2 they are eligible for a Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM). Some families with children in years 3 to 6 are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM). If you are unsure if you're eligible and/or you would like to apply, please [complete the form found here](#).

If you would like your child to have a hot school meal, you must order them online via the above link. The deadline for ordering meals is always midnight on Mondays for the following week. E.g. for meals w/c 1<sup>st</sup> September, the deadline will be midnight on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> August. If no selection is made, then you will need to provide your child with a packed lunch from home. **We do not have spare lunches delivered into school to cover anyone that has forgotten.**

Please remember we are a nut free school (this includes most chocolate spreads), and we promote healthy eating.

**The deadline for ordering meals for our first week back in September will be midnight on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> August.**

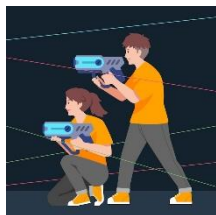
### PTFA Team Vacancy
