# **Pupil Absence**

If your child is going to be absent from school, please inform the school office:

If leaving a message or sending an e-mail, please give the child's name & Class/Year Group. We are required to record the **Reason for their Absence.** We need specific details rather than just "unwell". Please let us know your child's specific symptoms e.g. temperature, cold/flu symptoms, vomiting etc. Providing these details will prevent us calling you.

Please note that if your child has any sickness and/or diarrhoea, they must stay away from school for 48 hours from their last bout.

Please refer to the <u>NHS website</u> for further advice regarding whether to keep your child away from school if they are unwell.

# Jewellery & School attire

Please can we remind parents and carers of our school uniform policy.

#### **Uniform and shoes**

Full uniform must be adhered to.
Trainers should not be worn with normal school uniform. These are only for PE days when children come to school in their PE kits.
Ties must be worn with shirts (no polo shirts).



#### **Jewellery**

We ask children not to wear jewellery. Small gold colour stud earrings only are permitted and will need to be removed on PE days, or carefully covered with a sticking plaster (supplied by yourselves) to minimize dangers in PE or games.

#### Hair

Children's hair should be neat in appearance and tidy. We ask that children's hair is an appropriate style for school and must not reflect any extreme fashion and should not be dyed. Long hair should be tied back. We request that elaborate hair ties or hair bands are not used.

#### Nail Varnish & Make-up

We ask children not to wear nail varnish and/or any make-up to school.

#### Coats

Please ensure children bring an appropriate coat for the forecast weather.

### **Prevent Lost Property**

Please ensure that all items are clearly labelled with your child's full name. This includes, jumpers, cardigans, coats, hats, gloves, and water bottles.

# Under 7s Littledown Juniors Football League (Saturday mornings)

12 legacy spaces have been funded by the Billy Lardner Legacy Fund in memory of Billy who loved football and played at Littledown Juniors from age 5. Billy tragically died in June 2023 after being struck by a car near Bournemouth Airport. A legacy fund was established in Billy's name to enable young people in the local community to access sport and leisure facilities. In this first community initiative, the Lardner family has gifted funding from Billy's legacy to Littledown Juniors, a children's football league, to enable other budding footballers to enjoy the game, just like Billy had.

The legacy spaces are intended for children who are going through challenging times in their lives. For example, bereavement, family breakdown, family illness, loneliness etc.

#### **FREE Online Parent Course**

Helping our Children Stay Safe: 15<sup>th</sup> October 6:30 - 8:30pm.



Parenting children and young adults is hard, sometimes it can be scary and overwhelming with news stories and social media influencing how safe we feel our children are and the risks they may face in today's climate.

Join our FREE workshop to learn more about topics such as the influence of social media, the signs, and stages of exploitation, and how we can prevent young people being affected by knife crime as parents, carers and as a community.

This 2-hour workshop is hosted by The Ben Kinsella Trust and covers the following topics:

#### **Course Outline**

- Recognising the current landscape for young people; fear, exploitation, violence, and gangs
- Discuss the stages of exploitation, including the signs and stages
- Explore the risks of social media, 'Drill Music' and 'Gang-related music'
- Develop an understanding around language and slang
- Consider the trauma involved and gang life
- Understanding how 'issues' with peers can escalate and how we can help young people manage them
- Having meaningful conversations about difficult topics
- Preventing exploitation as parents and as a community
- Further support and resources

**Note:** A free place would need to be booked online but there is an option for a donation. Please note this must be booked by the parent/carer direct and they will need to have access to a computer.

#### **Head Lice**

We have been informed about a couple of isolated cases of headlice within school. Please can we kindly ask parents to regularly check children's hair for lice, and promptly treat any cases.



Head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families. They are not caused by dirty hair and are picked up by head-to-head contact. Lice crawl onto the body. They can't fly or jump. To prevent catching headlice, children should be reminded to avoid activities that involve <a href="hair">hair</a> contact, and not to share brushes, combs or headwear. As part of our uniform policy, long hair should be tied up at all times during the school day.

Please can we also remind you that it <u>is not</u> necessary to keep children away from school if they have, or have been recently treated for headlice.


