


# Hill View Primary School Reach For The Stars


If leaving a message or sending an e-mail, please give the child's name & Class/Year Group. We are required to record the **Reason** for their Absence. We need specific details rather than just "unwell". <u>Please let us know</u> <u>your child's specific symptoms</u> e.g. temperature, cold/flu symptoms, vomiting etc. Providing these details will prevent us calling you.

Please note that if your child has any sickness and/or diarrhoea, they must stay away from school <u>for 48 hours from their last bout</u>.

Please refer to the <u>NHS website</u> for further advice regarding whether to keep your child away from school if they are unwell.

### Road Safety & Parking





Last academic year we received several complaints from parents and residents regarding parking and road safety at drop off and pick up times. Dangerous parking is an increasing issue around schools, putting the safety of children and others at risk. Parking on zig-zag lines or pedestrian crossings can cause visibility issues to drivers and people walking the pavements alike.

#### Drivers should not park near a school entrance

This also includes anywhere that prevents access for emergency services, at or near a bus stop, opposite or within 10 metres of a junction, over a dropped kerb, and in front of an entrance to a property.

#### Drivers should not park on yellow zig-zag lines

These lines indicate the length of the road where stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited. Where there is an upright sign, there is a mandatory prohibition of stopping and/or waiting during the times shown. Yellow zig zag lines without signs do not have a Traffic Regulation Order and therefore, are not legally enforceable.

#### Drivers should not park on white zig-zag lines

Unlike yellow zig-zag lines, white zig-zag lines are enforced by local authorities and the police, and prohibit stopping or waiting even in the presence of a sign.

#### Drivers should not park on double yellow lines

Stopping or waiting on a double yellow line is strictly prohibited. Double yellow lines prevent vehicle owners from parking or waiting in this area at any time.

**Drivers should not park on single yellow lines at certain times** Single yellow lines prohibit parking during specific times. A nearby sign will indicate the times in which vehicle owners are allowed to park on single yellow lines.

# Drivers should not park on private forecourts and pedestrianised areas

We continue to receive complaints that parents are using the Post Office forecourt as a car park and blocking staff access/ exits. This is also a dangerous place to park and manoeuvre a vehicle while so many children and adults are walking in this pedestrian area.


