How we teach improper fractions:

$$\frac{3}{5} \leftarrow \text{numerator}$$
$$\frac{3}{5} \leftarrow \text{denominator}$$

Method 1:

Improper fractions to mixed numbers.

- 1) Divide the numerator by the denominator. Your answer will be the whole number.
- 2) The remainder will be the new numerator
- 3) The denominator stays the same.

Improper fraction $\left\{ \frac{15}{7} \right.$

$$15 \div 7 = 2 \text{ R } 1$$
$$\frac{15}{7} = 2 \frac{1}{7}$$

Method 2:

Mixed numbers to improper fractions

- 1) Multiply the whole number by the denominator
- 2) Add on the numerator
- 3) Your answer becomes the new numerator
- 4) Denominator stays the same

$$8 \frac{1}{2} = \frac{17}{2}$$

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
