Pupil Absence

All absences must be reported to the school office each morning that your child is off: Tel: 01202 514109 E-mail: office@hillview.bournemouth.sch.uk

We are required to record the **Reason for** children's absence. We need specific details rather than just "unwell". <u>Please let us know</u> your child's specific symptoms e.g. temperature, sore throat, vomiting etc. Providing this detail will prevent us calling you.

Please note that if your child has any sickness and/or diarrhoea, they must stay away from school <u>for 48 hours from their last bout</u>.

Please refer to the <u>NHS website</u> for further advice regarding whether to keep your child away from school if they are unwell.

Collection Arrangements

Please can we remind all parents/carer to inform your child's teacher or the office team if someone different (not already listed as authorised to collect) will be picking them up at the end of the school day. If you let the teacher know in the morning, you do not need to tell the office as well.

For safeguarding reasons, we are unable to release children to anyone that is not listed as authorised to collect the child unless we have received confirmation from the child's primary parent/carer. Thank you for your support and understanding.

Smart Watches

Please may we remind you that children are not allowed to wear SMART watches in school. A fitbit or similar gadget that counts steps only is fine, but any smart watch/device that is able to send/receive calls or messages or take photographs is treated the same as mobile phones and are not allowed to be used on site. Thank you.

Milk

We would like to remind parent and carers with children in Reception that once their child turns 5 years old, they are no longer eligible for free milk. If you wish for your child to continue having milk in school, you can register and pay for this through coolmilk. Please see below for more information.

If you wish, you can also provide a healthy nut-free alternative to the free fruit delivered to school for your child's morning snack.


We run ONLY in term time and not school holidays.








Recommended Read Book of the week (Y6)

Oranges In No Man's Land – Elizabeth Laird




